Brathay Trust secures support from The National Lottery Heritage Fund to conserve heritage and build on its 80-year legacy

Brathay Trust has successfully secured a significant development grant from The National Lottery Heritage Fund for its 'Brathay Blueprint: Boats, Buildings and Brighter Futures' project, it was announced today. Made possible thanks to National Lottery players, the project will use Brathay's 80-year heritage to build brighter futures for even more young people by conserving its historic estate, boat fleet and archive, and making them more accessible and relevant to people today.

The Heritage Fund award alongside a grant from the Francis Scott Trust will enable Brathay to progress its plans to develop a people focused future plan and apply for further funds in late 2026. This vital first step will enable Brathay to develop a comprehensive blueprint for the sustainable use of its heritage buildings and boats, while identifying opportunities for investment and adaptation that respect the site's unique character and legacy.

Brathay's heritage, nestled within a historic lakeside estate in the Lake District, includes Brathay Hall, Old Brathay, and two boathouses, a nationally significant archive dating back to 1946 charting the story of the Outdoor Learning Movement, and a rare fleet of traditional wooden Whaler boats which are regularly used on Windermere as part of the charity's residential programmes. Without this investment, these assets, and the skills, stories and inspiration they embody, could remain hidden, underused, or at risk of being lost to future generations.

The project will conserve and celebrate these assets while creating new opportunities for people to engage with them. From protecting traditional craft skills and connecting people with the Lake District, to celebrating outdoor learning and uncovering Brathay's pioneering past, the programme will ensure that Brathay's legacy continues to inspire, include and transform lives, particularly for young people and underrepresented groups. Elements of the archive will be digitised and put on display for greater access and as a permanent record of the charity's rich history to future generations.

Teresa Jennings, Chief Executive from Brathay Trust said: "We are absolutely delighted to have secured support from The National Lottery Heritage Fund for our Brathay Blueprint project. This investment will enable us to preserve and share the rich heritage of Brathay in ways that inspire future generations and strengthen our work with young people and communities. My thanks also to those that helped support our bid, namely, the Francis Scott Trust, University of Cumbria, Institute for Outdoor Learning, Lakeland Arts and Tim Farron MP."

Coinciding with Brathay Trust's 80th anniversary, the project will culminate in a live outdoor celebration in 2026, where supporters and communities will come together to launch the completed **Brathay Blueprint**, setting out the future of Brathay for generations to come.
