the Association for Family Therapy and Systemic Practice, UK. She is Deputy Director of PGT Taught Programmes (CEDAR) and Director of the Systemic Portfolio at the University of Exeter and works clinically as a psychotherapist and supervisor.



William Berisch Secretan: a person centred wilderness therapist, dramatherapist, psychodrama psychotherapist & environmental arts therapist. He works for North London

NHS Foundation Trust as Psychology Lead & Clinical Lead for Group Psychotherapy in Haringey, is managing director of the School of Environmental Arts Therapy (SEAT) and was the founder of the NHS Ecopsychology Network.



Avril Leonard: Clinical Practice Manager & Outdoor Therapist for Venture Trust, Scotland, UK. She oversees Venture Trusts unique Outdoor Therapy Service, delivering 1-to-1 therapy in accessible outdoor and wild spaces for those who may struggle to access traditional counselling services.
