


What does Ofsted say about outdoor learning?

that summer 2025 is officially the warmest summer on record for the UK.

It has been three years since the UK Government announced that it would ban the sale of peat for use in the amateur gardening sector, yet there is still no sign of legislation to enact the ban. On August 27th 2022, the Conservative Government promised to ban the sale of horticultural peat by 2024, "to protect peatlands and the natural environment". Read more....
